Gibb Brothers 1968

Released by The Beegees in 1968, it charted round the world but only reached No.1 in Canada, Netherlands, West Germany, and Switzerland.

It hovered at the bottom of the US Top twenty and settled at 8 in the UK.

Numerous cover versions appeared , mainly on albums.

In 1978 Rita Coolidge had a version at No,25 in the UK.

In 1996, Boyzone released a version on a CD compilation classed as a single,

It charted well in Europe, reaching No.1 in the UK, where it achieved PLATINUM status.
