



BESIDE THE SEASIDE

This is a popular British music hall song. It was written in 1907 by John H. Glover-Kind and first recorded it in 1909.

From about the 1930's it began to crop up in films and tv series quite frequently such as Cavalcade (1933), Sylvia Scarlett (1935), Bank Holiday (1938), The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes (1939), Carry On... Follow That Camel (1967): Oh What a Lovely War (1969)

Also Doctor Who, The Goodies and many more series.
It crops up in a Queen album from 1974

The song "Regular" by the band Badfinger has two lines from the song during the fade out.
The punk band The Sex Pistols incorporated this tune on stage in 2008.
It is a quintessential British song but it has strayed round the world via film and recordings for over 100 years
