MUST BE PLAYED WITH SWING- NOT 4 SQUARE

It charted in Billboards C&W chart for 6 weeks selling a million copies..

Ray Charles covered it in 1962 and entered the UK and US charts.

It is regarded as one of the greatest songs in Country music.

In 1958 Elvis Presleys version reached No 1 in the Billboard Hot 100.

In 1953 Frankie Laine and Joni James both had hit versions.

In 1962 Ray Charles took his version to No 29 in Billboard.
