

Bit of exercise here for the first and third finger on the neck. We are looking at the bars 4 to 6

In bar 4 play the 4 to 5 slide with the 3rd (ring) finger

In bar 5 play the 2 and 2-0 slide with the first finger and then the 4 and 4-2 slide with 3rd(ring) finger

In bar 6 play the 2 with the first and the 4 with the third fingers.

This song is included for several reasons. One is that it is a classic Doris day song from the 1950's and Doris was an icon of her days.

An other reason is that it was written by Paul Francis Webster , an American lyricist who won three Academy Awards for Best Original Song, and was nominated sixteen times for the award. He wrote well over 100 commercially successful songs (Look him up).

Doris was the biggest female film star of the 1960s.

She scored fifteen Top 40 singles on the Official UK Chart, including Number 1s Secret Love and Whatever Will Be Will Be (Que Sera Sera)
