



We suggest you listen to a recorded version ( Preferably Marty Robbins ) before attempting this.

3/4 timing but not waltzy . Needs to be steady to brisk. Note the **rests**.

THEY ARE CRITICAL . Tap the banjo head or bang your foot or whatever works for you when you meet a rest sign.

If you know the words it will really help. As we pointed out when we started this site. Its easier to learn a tune when you can fit the words . It helps to pace the tune properly

Have a go . Its worth it for this Country classic.

Marty Robbins, released in 1959. It became a major hit on both the country and pop music charts, becoming the first No. 1 hit of the 1960s on both.

It won the Grammy Award for Best Country & Western Recording in 1961.

In 1998, the 1959 recording of "El Paso" by Marty Robbins was inducted into the Grammy Hall of Fame.

There were a number of cover versions over the years but none anywhere near the classic Marty Robbins version
